


Prime Minister in Action

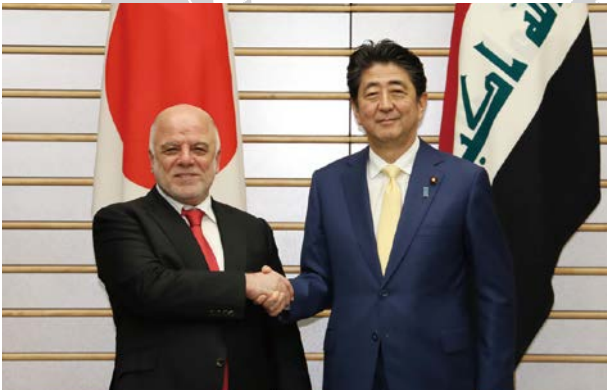
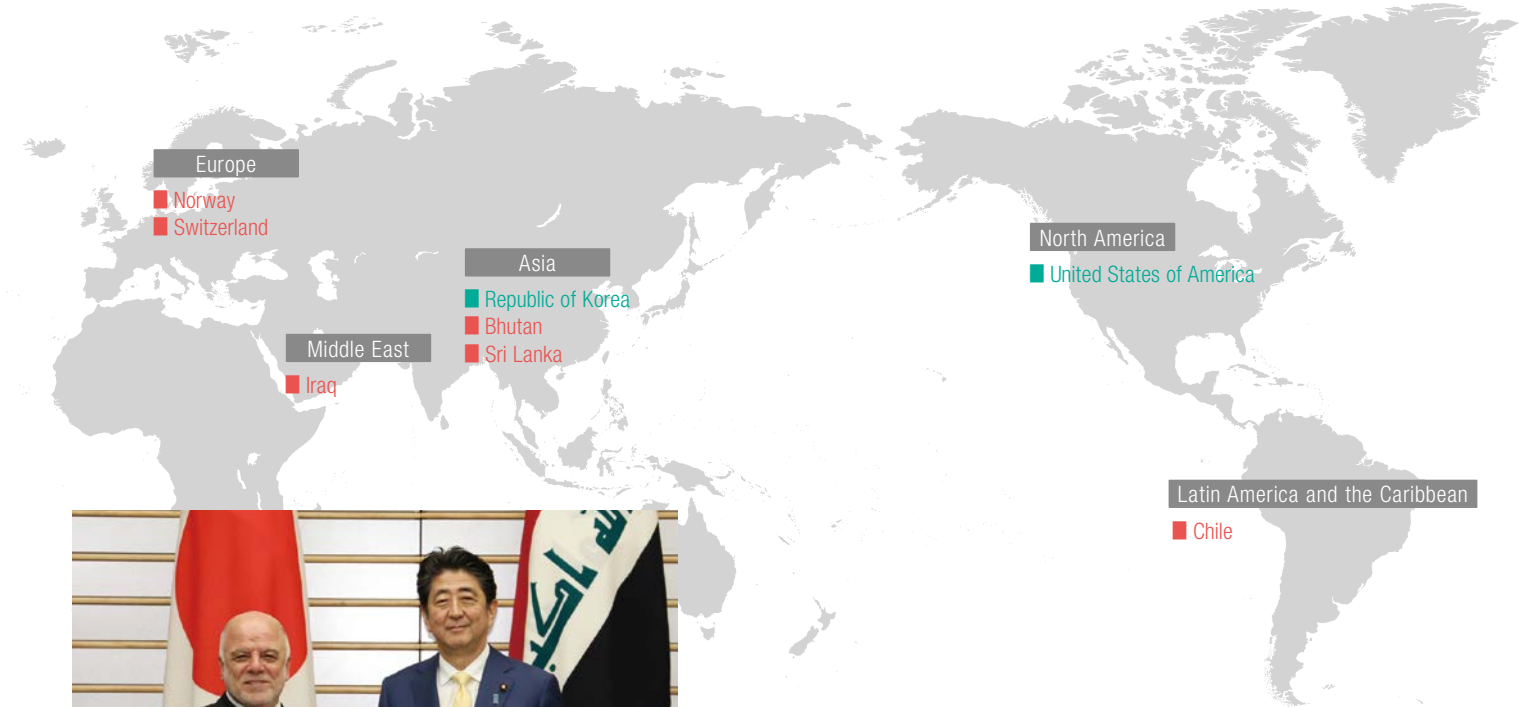

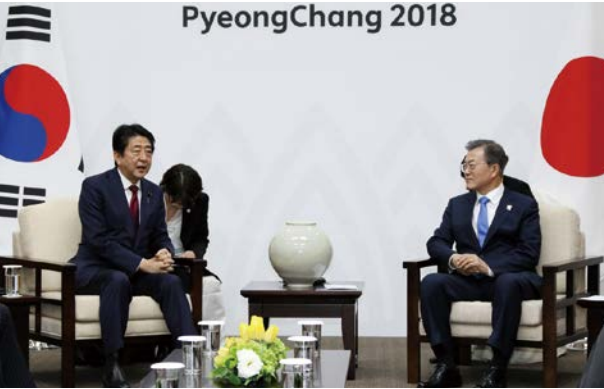
